



Preparing for In-service; What to Expect on Your Test

Course Description

On February 24, 2010, emergency medicine residents across the country will take the National Emergency Medicine In-training Examination. This examination is meant to simulate the type of questions encountered on the Written Board Certification Examination. Although many residency programs place a high value on the results of the In-training Examination, the amount of preparation amongst residency programs and individual residents varies considerably. This course will serve as an intense review of many of the topics that represent "high risk" for appearing on the examination.
