



Coming to an ED Near You – Bringing Military Medical Advancements to the Civilian Emergency System

Course Description

This course will provide an update on the prehospital and emergency department (ED) care of the emergency patient and focus on bringing battle-tested techniques to the civilian ED. Topics discussed will include aeromedical evacuation, prehospital airway management, hemostatic resuscitation, wound management, fluid and blood component therapy, advanced vascular access, new threats in disaster medicine, and emergency ultrasound and medical imaging.
